



## COVID-19 Testing for Farmers

As a farmer, you can help slow the spread of COVID-19, keep your employees healthy and keep your farm operating at 100 percent. TestNebraska has some options for you!

As a farmer, you can encourage your employees to sign up on at [TestNebraska.com](https://TestNebraska.com) (English) or [TestNebraska.com/es](https://TestNebraska.com/es) (Spanish). They will be asked to take a short survey and then to schedule a test. Testing is free, optional, available and encouraged in Nebraska to help slow the spread of COVID-19.

If your employees want to sign up through TestNebraska but are unable to because they don't have internet access, then you can help schedule tests for them. Check the TestNebraska website for a testing site near you. Once you determine which location and date works best for your employees, contact the TestNebraska hotline 402-207-9377 to schedule tests.

When you contact the hotline, tell the hotline operator how many employees you would like to have tested and explain that the employees will be brought together (if this is what you desire). This will ensure that there are enough tests on hand at the TestNebraska testing site.

Testing for COVID-19 is completely optional and is available for your farm's benefit and wellbeing. Scheduling and arranging testing for your employees is up to each individual farm.

Offering testing to the Nebraska farming community will not only help crush the curve but also maintain the food supply and agriculture industry within our state.
