These guidance documents are advisory in nature but are binding on an agency until amended by such agency. A guidance document does not include internal procedural documents that only affect the internal operations of the agency and does not impose additional requirements or penalties on regulated parties or include confidential information or rules and regulations made in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act. If you believe that these guidance documents impose additional requirements or penalties on regulated parties, you may request a review of the document.

Title 19, Chapter 3 – The Nebraska Honey Standards Regulations

Pursuant to the Department's authority under <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §81-2,181, these regulations provide standards which apply to all honey produced by honeybees and cover all styles of honey presentations ultimately intended for direct consumption and to all honey packed, processed or intended for sale in bulk containers.

Title 23, Chapter 1 – Nebraska Livestock Disease Reporting Regulations

These regulations aid in carrying out the provisions of <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §54-742, regarding the development of a livestock disease reporting system to assist in the prevention, suppression, control, and eradication of dangerous, infectious, contagious, or otherwise transmissible livestock diseases. The livestock diseases are categorized according to relative economic or health risk factors.

<u>Title 23, Chapter 2 – Animal Importation Regulations</u>

These regulations aid in administering the Animal Importation Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§54784.01-54-796, §54-753.05, other acts under the Department's authority, and related provisions of Title 9 of the Code of Federal Regulations. They are intended to protect the health of Nebraska animals through the regulation of or prohibition of certain activities relating to the importation of animals into Nebraska.

<u>Title 23, Chapter 3 – Cattle Brucellosis Regulations</u>

These regulations govern the enforcement of the Nebraska Bovine Brucellosis Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§54-1367 to 54-1384. They are intended to assist in the control and eradication of bovine brucellosis.

Title 23, Chapter 4 – Swine Brucellosis Regulations

These regulations govern the enforcement of the Nebraska Swine Brucellosis Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§54-1348 to 54-1366. They are intended to further the control and eradication of swine brucellosis.

Title 23, Chapter 9 – Poultry Disease Control Regulations

These regulations govern the enforcement of the Nebraska Poultry Disease Control Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§2-3001 to 2-3008. They are intended to assist in this by the control, eradication, and monitoring of poultry diseases such as pullorum and typhoid; low pathogenic avian influenza Type A; and various subtypes of avian influenza in noncommercial poultry. They also establish requirements for poultry being exhibited, imported, or both; establish testing requirements; and establish monitoring for the presence of any other dangerous, infectious, contagious, or otherwise transmissible disease of poultry.

<u>Title 23, Chapter 10 – Rendering and Pet Feed Manufacturing Regulations</u>

These regulations are intended to aid in carrying out the legislative intent and general purposes of the Nebraska Meat and Poultry Inspection Law, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§54-1901 to 54-1915 applicable to rendering and pet feed manufacturing establishments. They, for instance, set requirements for sanitation and operation of such establishments, transportation of the products, and inspection and processing of dead or fallen animals.

Title 23, Chapter 11 – Livestock Dealer Regulations

These regulations are to aid in the enforcement of the Nebraska Livestock Dealer Licensing Act, <u>Neb.</u> <u>Rev. Stat.</u> §§54-1701 to 54-1711. They set requirements related to inspection and handling of livestock and of licensing; bonding; recordkeeping; and condition and type of facilities to prevent or control the transmission of livestock diseases.

Title 23, Chapter 12 – Livestock Auction Market Regulations

These regulations are to aid in the administration and enforcement of the Livestock Auction Market Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§54-1156 to 54-1182. They establish requirements related to application for a license and the inspection, handling, and identification of livestock moving through Nebraska auction market or purposes of disease control and maintaining the health of Nebraska's livestock industry.

<u>Title 23, Chapter 14 – Garbage Feeding Regulations</u>

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Department in <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §54-753.01 (4), these regulations allow for materials which are by-products of commercial food processing operations to be exempt from this section and <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §54-753.04.

<u>Title 23, Chapter 15 – Pseudorabies Regulations</u>

These regulations aid in implementing the Pseudorabies Control and Eradication Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§54-2235 to 54-22,100. They include provisions to carry out a program designed to control pseudorabies and eradicate pseudorabies from all swine herds where pseudorabies is found and to use surveillance to achieve and maintain pseudorabies-free conditions in the state.

Title 23, Chapter 16 – Domesticated Cervine Animal Regulations

These regulations govern and aid in the enforcement of the Domesticated Cervine Animal Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§54-2302 to 54-2324, and <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §37-505. These regulations are intended to control and eradicate disease, and to provide requirements for the intrastate movement, importation, identification, and containment of domesticated cervine animals.

<u>Title 23, Chapter 17 – Livestock Composting Regulations</u>

These regulations establish the operating procedures for composting livestock carcasses in compliance with <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §54-744.

Title 23, Chapter 18 - Commercial Dog and Cat Operator Inspection Regulations

These regulations govern the enforcement of the Commercial Dog and Cat Operator Inspection Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. §§54-625 to 54-643. Specifically, these regulations set forth requirements for the humane handling, care, treatment, and transportation of regulated dogs and cats. The regulations also establish requirements related to inspection of facilities; complaints regarding dog and cat facility operators or those believed to be operating; identification of regulated dogs and cats; recordkeeping; assessment of administrative fines; and license enforcement actions.

<u>Title 23, Chapter 19 – Scrapie Control and Eradication Regulations</u>

These regulations are intended to aid in the administration of the Scrapie Control and Eradication Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§54-2701 to 54-2761. These regulations establish requirements for eradicating scrapie when found and to use surveillance to achieve and maintain scrapie-free conditions in the state.

Title 23, Chapter 20 - Food Supply Animal Veterinary Incentive Program Regulations

These regulations aid in administering the provisions of the Food Supply Animal Veterinary Incentive Program Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§54-501 to 54-508, by establishing an application process and contractual requirements for persons seeking to apply to this program.

Title 25, Chapter 3 – Nebraska Commercial Feed Regulations

These regulations implement the Commercial Feed Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§54-847 to 54-863, concerning the sale of commercial feed, including labeling, expression of guarantees, feed ingredients listed, directions for use, drug additives, and good manufacturing practices.

<u>Title 29, Chapter 2 – Livestock Friendly County Regulations</u>

These regulations establish a procedure for the designation of livestock friendly counties in Nebraska to aid in administering <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§54-2801 to 54-2802. They establish a process to recognize and assist efforts to counties to maintain or expand their livestock sector.

Title 30, Chapter 1 – Potato Development Regulations

These regulations aid in the enforcement of the Nebraska Potato Development Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§2-1801 to 2-1811. They set the excise tax and recordkeeping requirements.

Title 33, Chapter 1 – Packer Bonding Regulations

These regulations govern the enforcement of the Nebraska Livestock Sellers Protective Act, <u>Neb. Rev.</u> <u>Stat.</u> §§54-1801 to 54-1808. They set requirements for registration, bonding, reports, and statements relating to the sale of slaughter livestock.

Title 31, Chapter 1 – Poultry and Egg Marketing Regulations

These regulations govern the enforcement of the Nebraska Poultry and Egg Resources Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§2-3401 to 2-3416. They set fees and establish recordkeeping and filing requirements, an exemption, and the process to obtain a refund.

<u>Title 19, Chapter 2 – Farm Mediation Regulations</u>

These regulations set for procedures to implement the Farm Mediation Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§2-4801 to 2-4815. These regulations provide procedures for farm mediation services and set fee guidelines for these services. The regulations set out requirements for mediators including educational requirements.

<u>Title 19, Chapter 4 – Practice and Procedure Regulations</u>

These regulations set forth the Department of Agriculture's procedures for rulemaking petitions, declaratory orders, and contested cases.

Title 19, Chapter 5 – Negotiated Rulemaking Practice and Procedure Regulations

These regulations set forth the Department of Agriculture's procedures for negotiated rulemaking.

Title 19, Chapter 1 – Nebraska Apiary Act Regulations

These regulations implement the Nebraska Apiary Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§81-2,165 to 81-2,180. These regulations set procedures for the movement or sale of an apiary by requiring certification from the Department and the payment of a certification fee to prevent the dissemination of contagious or infectious diseases, parasites, or pests of honeybees.

Title 25, Chapter 2 – Pesticide Regulations

These regulations implement the Pesticide Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§2-2622 to 2-2659. These regulations set standards for pesticide applicators, recordkeeping of pesticide applications, and the issuance of pesticide emergency exemption permits. These regulations also set pesticide registration fees and administrative fines for violations of the Act and provide for technical interpretations regarding the use of pesticides.

<u>Title 25, Chapter 4 – Buffer Strip Regulations</u>

These regulations implement the Buffer Strip Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§2-5101 to 2-5111. These regulations set standards for and provide restrictions for types of vegetation suitable for buffer strips, width of buffer strips, types of surface water and soil appropriate for protection by buffer strips, appropriate payment and priority of funding for buffer strips and requirements for contractual agreements relating to buffer strips.

<u>Title 25, Chapter 6 – Commercial Fertilizer and Soil Conditioner Inspection Fees</u>

These regulations implement the Nebraska Commercial Fertilizer and Soil Conditioner Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§81-2,162.01 to 81-2,162.28. These regulations set the inspection fees on commercial fertilizers and soil conditioners distributed in Nebraska.

<u>Title 25, Chapter 7 – Nebraska Seed Law</u>

These regulations implement the Nebraska Seed Law Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§81-2,147 to 81-2,147.12. These regulations set standards and provide restrictions on germination, labeling, sampling, inspecting, analyzing, testing, and examining agricultural, vegetable, and flower seed.

<u>Title 25, Chapter 8 – Industrial Hemp Regulations</u>

These regulations aid in the administration of the Industrial Hemp Statute, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §2-5701. These regulations set forth procedures for postsecondary institutions growing or cultivating industrial hemp to register, report, and provide access to the Department of Agriculture in order to monitor and test the industrial hemp fields.

Title 25, Chapter 10 – Noxious Weed Regulations

These regulations implement the Noxious Weed Control Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§2-945.01 to 2-966. These regulations list the officially designated noxious weeds, establish control measures to be used in

particular situations and provide for the monitoring of implementation of the Act by the country control authorities.

<u>Title 25, Chapter 12 – Agricultural Liming Materials Regulations</u>

These regulations aid in administering the Agricultural Liming Materials Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§2-4301 to 2-4327. These regulations adopt specifications used by the Association of Official Analytical Chemists for testing agricultural liming materials, set standards for determining the fineness of liming materials and set the inspection fee to be paid on all agricultural liming materials distributed in the state.

Title 25, Chapter 13 – Plant Protection and Plant Pest Act Regulations

These regulations implement the Plant Protection and Plant Pest Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§21072 to 2-10,117. These regulations set standards and provide for restrictions on the movement and care of plants with the purpose of protecting the plant industry and agricultural interests of the state.

<u>Title 27, Chapter 1 – Voluntary Registration of Sales and Repair Personnel Regulations</u>

These regulations implement §89-187(3) (a) of the Weights and Measures Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§89-182.01 to 89-1,103. These regulations provide requirements for the voluntary registration of sales and repair personnel, employee sales and repair personnel, and sales and repair businesses for commercial weighing and measuring devices including fees, qualifications, and standards for work on such devices.

<u>Title 27, Chapter 2 – Weights and Measures Standard Laboratory Operating Procedures and Fees</u>

These regulations implement §89-187(3) (c) (ii) of the Weights and Measures Act, <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> §§89-182.01 to 89-1,103. These regulations establish weights and measures standard laboratory operating procedures for testing, correcting, calibrating, and verifying secondary standards and set fees for the

laboratory services.

These regulations implement the Weights and Measures Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§89182.01 to 89-1,103 as the Act relates to weighing and measuring devices which are scales. These regulations set standards and impose restrictions on the instillation characteristics of vehicle, axle load, livestock, and railroad track scales.

Title 36, Chapter 1 – The Nebraska Soil and Plant Analysis Laboratory Act Regulations

These regulations implement the Nebraska Soil and Plant Analysis Laboratory Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§2-3101 to 2-3110. These regulations establish minimum standards for plant analysis to ensure that test results will be accurate within an acceptable range.

<u>Title 91 – Beginning Farmer Board – Chapter 1 – Beginning Farmer Tax Credit Act Regulations</u>

These regulations aid in the administration of the Beginning Farmer Tax Credit Act, <u>Neb</u>. <u>Rev</u>. <u>Stat</u>. §§77-5201 to 77-5215. These regulations establish criteria required for tax credit eligibility guidelines which take into account the region of the state, number of acres, land quality and type, type of operation, type of crops or livestock raised, and other factors of farming or livestock production.
